#### CONCEPTUAL APPROACH INTERCONNECTING CONCENTRIC CIRCLES

Interconnecting concentric circles are a central motif in The Dragon's Roar, linking the ground plane and the vertical structural elements.


The circle's significance stems from its symbolism within Chinese religion, culture, and philosophy. As the most democratic of geometric forms, it is a transcultural symbol of radiance.

In Chinese culture, concentric circles are used as a powerful visualization of the state of being' in the world; the self and the individual are positioned at the center of a series of concentric circles, with ever increasing dimensions symbolic of family, social groups, culture, country, earth and ultimately cosmos. These circles embody an energy that is both centrifugal and centripetal; energy flows inwards and outwards.

When concentric circles connect, they exemplify the ripple effect of interactions in life and in being, on earth and beyond. This story of interconnectivity of all things is also witnessed in other powerful symbols present in Chinese culture, including the Buddhist story of the Net of Indra-

Interconnecting concentric circles provide an analogy for the spirit of New York City's Chinatown-a place defined by the intermingling of diverse social and cultural groups, moving, mingling, mixing and dancing together to produce a unique vibrancy. The circle's notion of reciprocal exchange between inner and outer further mirrors the vitality of social transactions within the vicinity of New York's Chinetown.

While the concentric circle is present in both The Dragon's Roar ground plane and the skin of the tower structure's drum-like cylinders, the motifican also promote further interconnection to other Gateways to Chinatown by future incorporation into the design of these areas (i.e. repeating the ground plane motif and potentially tower elements at
